The Role

Survey Technicians lead the activities of a field survey crew and instruct on survey techniques. They keep accurate field notes, records, and sketches of work performed. They ensure measurements are precise, research information, prepare maps, and present findings to relevant groups or individuals.

- Leads the activities of a field survey crew and instructs in survey techniques
- Oversees daily activities of crews
- Complete timesheets for work crew on a daily basis
- Keeps accurate notes, records, and sketches of work performed and data secured
- Submit daily site inspections to supervisor
- Correctly document disbursements
- Ensure that all field notes are complete (i.e. traverse/boundary lines coloured, station and backsight information recorded, north area/street names/lot numbers included, provide legal description, date, weather, personnel, GPS site calibration, etc.)
- Ensure traverse loops are closed
- Ensure resections are completed utilizing multiple backsights and proper geometry
- Obtain redundant measurements on traverse points
- Ensure proper functioning and use of all company equipment
- Report malfunctioning and broken equipment
- Ensure all equipment is returned to vehicle prior to leaving work site
- Undertake regular/documented checking of tribrach's, prism poles and levels. Tribrach's and prism
 poles at least weekly
- Determine work hours for field crew within parameters of company policies
- Interact with clients to provide details of work to be done or completed
- Reviews existing plans and deeds to survey areas in detail
- Train instrument persons on the use of company equipment and survey techniques
- Responsible for the safety of all parties in a work crew and for traffic control on all work sites.
- Understand the company's health & safety policies and ensure that each crew member works in a safe manner and with the necessary safety equipment per company policy
- Train new employees in safe working methods
- Evaluate field data, formulate preliminary and detailed designs and drawings for various engineering and planning projects using information from field data and existing survey information.
- Draw diagrams, profiles, plans using cross-sections and surveys to represent elevations, topographical contours and structures.
- Produce detailed and concise drawings and plans with technical accuracy under the direction of the Project Manager.
